Writing for Academic Success and Career Preparation

Lees-McRae College developed an integrated, multi-curricular approach to the Quality Enhancement Plan (QEP) that aligns with the mission, strategic plan and educational hallmarks of the institution. After analysis of academic program assessments, faculty, staff and student survey results and QEP committee discussions and research, the need for a writing-focused QEP emerged.

Feedback from Lees-McRae College constituents, combined with review of relevant literature, validated the QEP's focus on improving student writing. Based on the literature review, the committee chose to build a culture of writing excellence that includes assessing and aligning writing-intensive and seminar series courses, promoting a culture of writing for academic success and career preparation, integrating support systems to facilitate learning for all students and incorporating professional development of faculty.

Your Writing Elevated focuses on foundational writing in the freshmen and sophomore years as well as enhancing writing instruction and support across campus. The College has established the Ratchford Writing Center, supported by a Writing Council who serve as advisors for the operation of the center and the QEP. The Writing Council works in conjunction with the existing Writing Across the Curriculum (WAC) Committee to support the mission of the QEP.
